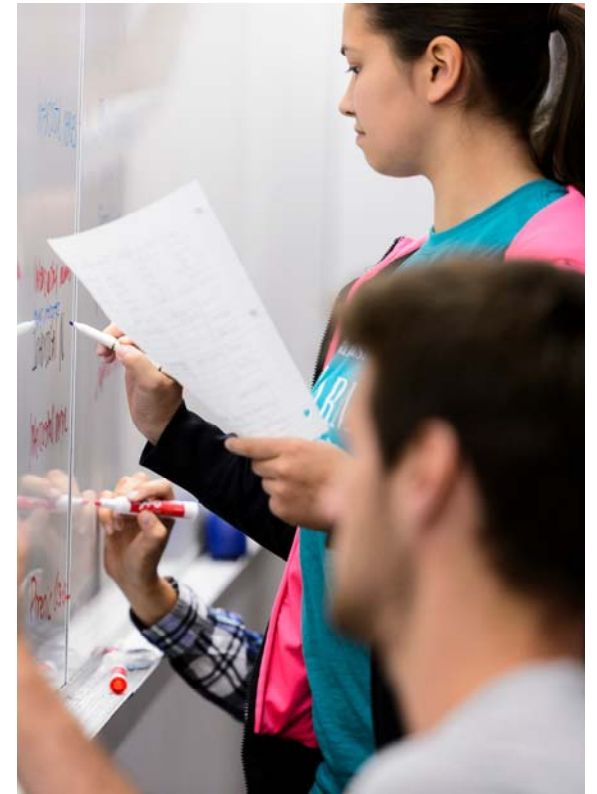

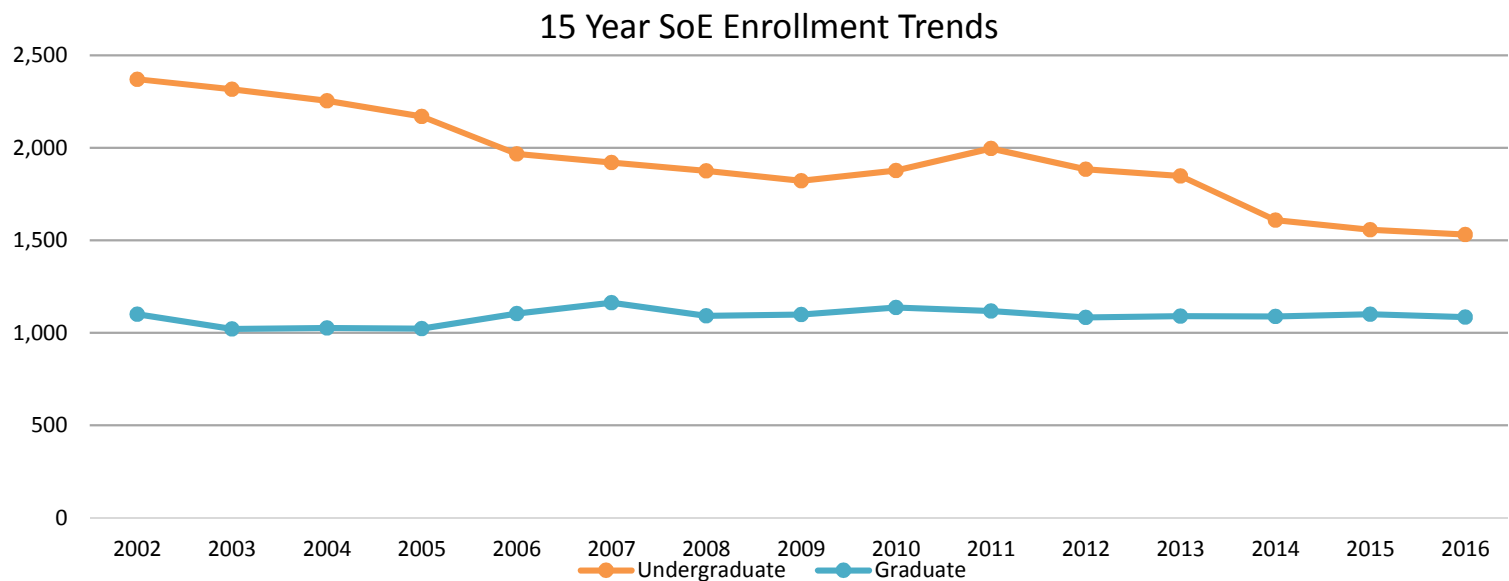

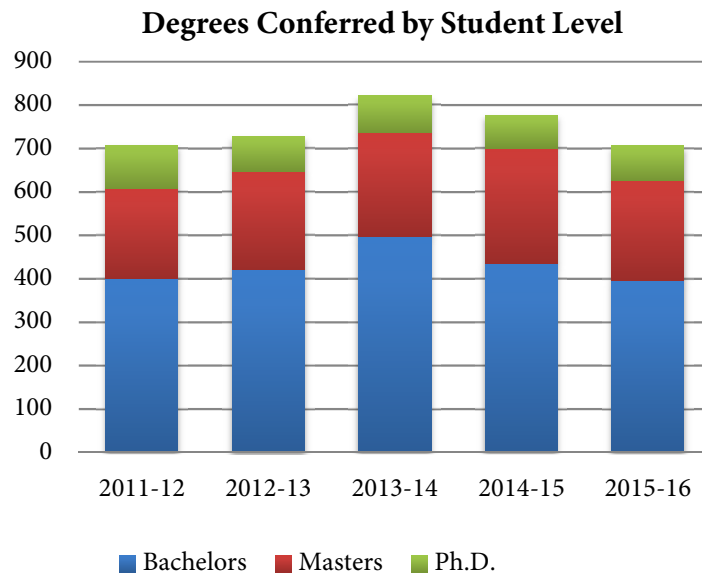

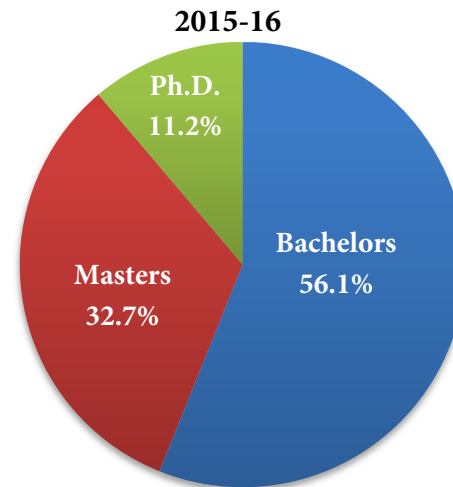

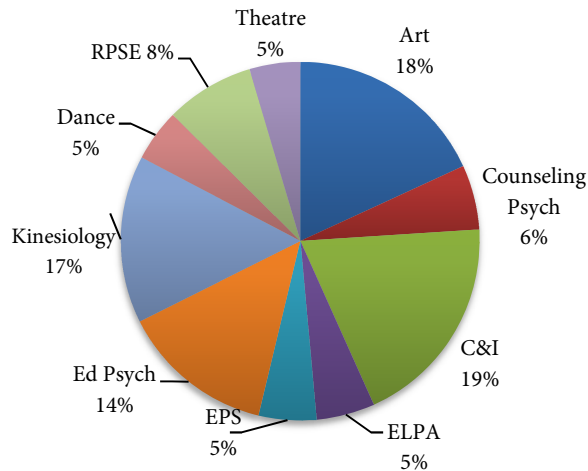
Credit Production by Department, Academic Year



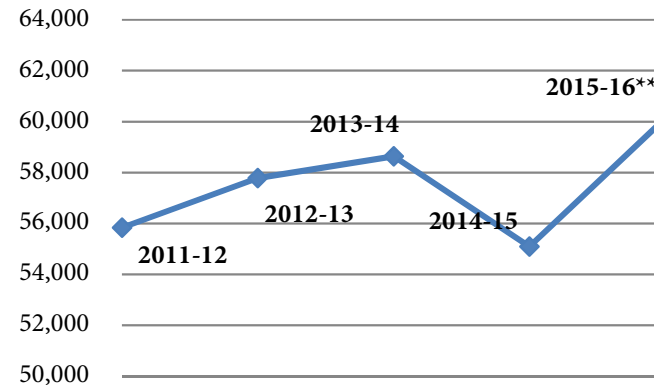

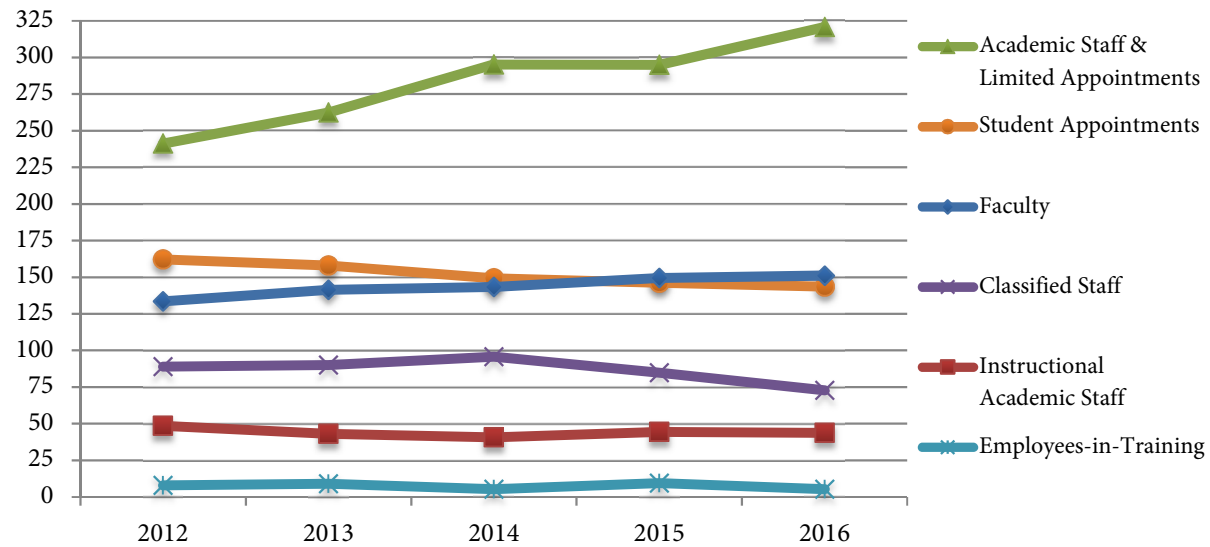

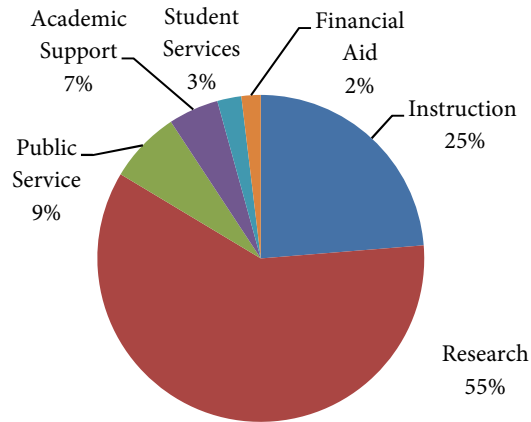

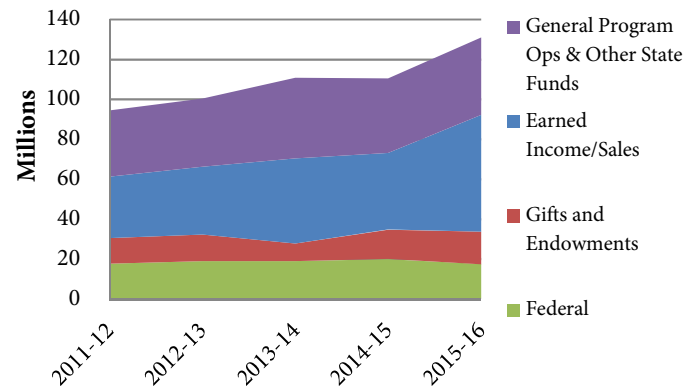
