Certificate in Athletic Healthcare, Andrew Winterstein, Clinical Professor in Kinesiology

The Certificate in Athletic Healthcare was designed to appeal to a wide variety of students using a definition of “athletics” that extends into areas of team-building and outside of sports exclusively. The program also hopes to include broader electives that would reflect this viewpoint, allowing for a more diverse set of courses to be taken as part of the certificate.

Proposal passed unanimously.

Occupation Therapy OTD, Sharon Gartland, OT Program Director

There are two branches of the Occupation Therapy Doctorate (OTD). The Entry Level Named Option is proposed to keep in line with changes in the field, and would take three years to complete. The four main themes of the OTD include Excellence in Practice, Research, Leadership, and Wellness and Health Promotion. The Entry Level Named Option would consist of 97 credits, also keeping in line with OTD programs at other universities. The cost would be \$1,000 per credit, with in-state students receiving a reduced rate of \$800 per credit.

Dan Lisowski asked about TA/RA/PA position opportunities as part of the program, to which Sharon Gartland noted that the three-year program would not provide opportunities for TA/RA/PA positions due to the course workload.

Sharon Gartland also discussed the Post Professional Named Option as another way to keep up with competitors. This program would take two years to complete and would award 31 credits upon entry into the program for prior graduate level coursework.

The committee also discussed the relationship between 101 and 131 students in this program and more broadly at the university.

Proposal passed unanimously.
