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Rationale and Justifications

Why is the program being proposed? What is its purpose?

Several students who have taken some of the education law courses have expressed interest in being able to earn a certificate in this area of specialization. There are many different legal issues arising in schools right now (e.g., banned books, changes to affirmative action, anti-trans policies, inequitable funding practices). The certificate will address many of these pressing issues from a legal perspective.

How is the certificate program designed to complement the degree/major of participating students?

We are hoping the certificate might serve as a gateway for students from other programs. For example, a law student who pursues the 9-credit certificate might also consider our master's in ed policy (with the education law strand).

Do current students need or want the program? Provide evidence.

When education law courses were taught to our PhD students, who are also practicing administrators, several of them asked the department if we could create an education law certificate program. They need more legal expertise to confront the many dilemmas that arise in schools – especially civil rights-related issues. I am happy to provide names of students who approached me from this class and others.

What is the market, workforce, and industry need for this program? Provide evidence.

Current ELPA graduate students and graduate students from Law and La Follette have expressed an interest in having a graduate certificate reflected on their transcript that indicates a focus on education law. For example, some law students will eventually practice in the area of education law. This certificate would give them some additional expertise about pressing legal issues that impact schools. Likewise, education students who are aspiring principals and superintendents have discussed their interest in additional education law coursework. School leaders would benefit from additional coursework in this area as several legal issues that intersect with students' civil rights arise on a daily basis. Creating the Graduate Certificate in Education Law and Civil Rights will continue to build on this interest and momentum.

What gap in the program array is it intended to fill?

The proposed program at UW Madison will instead be focused on civil rights law/education to distinguish ourselves.

The courses included in this program cover topics involving discriminatory practices against populations that have been historically marginalized in schools. Through a legal lens, we analyze existing case law, statutes, and regulations to assist those working in schools create policies that are inclusive and meet their legal obligations. The attached proposal identifies a few learning outcomes.

This will be a graduate professional certificate program as opposed to a capstone certificate program. Thus, the students participating in this program will have already been recruited to the UW and are already enrolled in of our programs. Specifically, the UW admissions program will have already recruited the students while considering equity. Also, this is only a 9-credit certificate program that involves existing courses, so advising will be less intensive when compared to a masters or PhD program. Nevertheless, we will have a point person who meets and supports students' academic needs to ensure success across the three courses.

In ELPA, we have been trying to recruit lawyers who also have a PhD. We are explicitly recruiting instructors with diverse backgrounds to teach in our education law-related courses. As this certificate program grows, we hope to hire a more diverse teaching pool to work as a team with the existing ELPA faculty.

We already have several PhD students, who are practicing administrators who have asked for this program. We also have several law students who have pursued education courses and/or degrees in the past. Many law students already take 6 credits at the School of Education, so this certificate would only require one additional course. We imagine several will pursue this certificate.

What is the recruiting and admissions strategy for underrepresented students?

As noted above, UW will have already recruited students from underrepresented groups to campus. We are simply offering a certificate to students who have already been recruited and admitted. We expect that many of these students will already be enrolled in one of our education-law related courses and will decide to pursue the certificate.

It really will not impact the department because all of these courses are regularly offered. If enrollment is low, we will have the same number of students who would have been enrolled before the certificate began. If enrollment is higher than expected, we already have identified a very diverse pool of instructors (adjuncts/lecturers) who have the legal backgrounds to teach these courses. We are happy to provide names of this diverse pool of instructors.

Graduate/professional certificates require at least 9 and typically no more than 12 total credits.

At least 6 credits of graduate-level coursework (i.e., courses numbered 700 or above, or 300 or above with the graduate attribute) must be earned to satisfy graduate/professional certificate requirements.

Graduate/professional certificates will be awarded at the same time the student's degree/major is awarded and will not be awarded independent of an earned degree.

All required courses are approved through the school/college level.

Courses are offered on a regular basis to allow timely completion.

Courses have enrollment capacity.

All requirements consist of courses numbered 300 or higher.

Courses in which a student elects the pass/fail grading option or audit option will not satisfy certificate requirements.

Ideally, topics courses will only be included if all offerings/topics of the given course can be used to satisfy requirements.

All requirements must be met; exceptions that amount to waiving requirements are not permitted.

Course substitutions to the curriculum should be kept to a minimum; if substitutions are being made on a regular basis, the curriculum should be re-examined. When course substitutions are made, the substituted course should be $formally\ added\ to\ the\ curriculum\ through\ governance\ for\ inclusion\ in\ the\ curriculum\ the\ following\ academic\ year.$

Substitutions are not permitted for any course unless the substitution would be provided for every student with the same substitution request.

At least half of the credits must be earned in residence (UW-Madison on campus, study abroad, or distance courses); exceptions to the minimum residency requirement are not permitted.

Unless otherwise specified, students must earn a minimum grade of C in each course used to meet certificate requirements. Students must achieve a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA for all courses required for the certificate.

The program faculty/staff will ensure the program website, Advance Your Career materials if applicable, and other presentations are consistent with the Guide information for this program.

Certificates will not be awarded retroactively to graduated students who completed all requirements before the program was approved. In addition, certificates will not be awarded to students who complete all certificate requirement but failed to officially declare the certificate before graduating, or to students who completed requirements after graduating via additional coursework or course substitution/exception.
